## VERIFIED MÉTIS FAMILY LINE ASSESSMENT DOCUMENT ROUSSAIN-TURNER FAMILY LINE (FL4010)

### 1 Overview of this Document

This Verified Métis Family Line Assessment Document, along with others, have been prepared by the MNO Registry in order to identify Métis families who were a part of Historic Métis Communities in Ontario.<sup>1</sup> These communities existed in some parts of Ontario where distinctive Métis collectivities who, in addition to their mixed Aboriginal ancestry, developed their own customs, way of life, and recognizable group identity separate from their First Nation and European forebearers, prior to the Crown effecting political and legal control in a given region.

The MNO represents various regional rights-bearing Métis communities throughout Ontario; these communities consist of the Descendants of the Métis Root Ancestors who made up Historic Métis Communities. Based on the Descendants of these Métis Root Ancestors applying for citizenship within the MNO, the MNO is authorized—through democratic governance structures at the local, regional and provincial levels—to represent the collectively-held rights, interests and claims of these modern-day Métis communities.

Flowing from this authorization, the MNO has adopted a Harvesting Policy to manage the activities of Métis harvesters in Ontario. This Policy provides that an MNO citizen who ancestrally connects to a Métis Root Ancestor is eligible for an MNO Harvester's Card for the identified Traditional Harvesting Territories (also known as Harvesting Areas) that corresponds to the Historic Métis Community to which the citizen's Root Ancestor belonged. To fully understand what is required in order to be issued a Harvester's Card, this Verified Métis Family Line Assessment Document must be read with the *MNO Registry Policy for Identifying and Documenting Verified Métis Family Lines for the Purposes of Issuing Harvesters Certificates to Citizens* ("MNO Harvesters Certificate Policy").

### 2 Rationale for Inclusion as Verified Métis Family Line

The Roussain-Turner family was part of the Historic Métis Community of Sault Ste. Marie (the "Métis Community").

The Métis Root Ancestors for this Verified Métis Family Line are Charles Roussain and Elizabeth Turner. Both were Documented Métis; they were enumerated as "H.B." (Half Breed) on the 1861 Census. The earliest reference to the Roussain-Turner family in the Métis Community is at the birth of Root Ancestor Charles and Elizabeth's son, John Joseph Roussain, at Batchawana Bay in 1846. This places the family in the Métis Community four years prior to Effective Control.

The Historic Records demonstrate that the Root Ancestors and their Descendants spent their lives in the Métis Community, as they were repeatedly documented there. Two of the Root Ancestors' three sons were recorded as being born in the Métis Community, one in 1846 in Batchawana Bay, and another in 1883 at Mamainse Harbour, located just north of Batchawana Bay. In 1861, the Métis Root Ancestors were enumerated with five children in 1861 at Mamainse. In that same year, a government inspector of fisheries named Charles Roussain in his 1861 report, stating that he was a "half breed" who had occupied a fishery at Coppermine Point for the previous six years (Coppermine Point is located at Batchawana Bay). Root Ancestor Charles was enumerated as a fisherman at Batchawana Bay in 1871 and 1881.

Root Ancestor Descendant John Joseph Roussain married in Sault Ste. Marie in 1877, and had twelve known children, five of whom were recorded as being born in Mamainse. In 1881, he was enumerated as a fisherman in Batchawana Bay, and in 1891 he was recorded as a fisherman in Mamainse. A report authored by Ontario's Bureau of Mines in 1893 states that John Joseph occupied a fishing station on the Mamainse headline referred to as "Roussainville." One of John Joseph's sons, Francis Edmond Roussain, was appointed in 1910 as the lighthouse keeper at Coppermine Point (just north of Batchawana Bay). In 1918, Francis Edmond married in Sault Ste. Marie.

Root Ancestor Descendant, Edgar Roussain, brother of John Joseph, was also enumerated as a fisherman on the 1871 Census of Batchawana Bay. He married there in 1878, and their eldest sons were born in Mamainse. in 1911, he and five of his children were enumerated in Batchawana Bay. Peter Roussain, a son of Edgar Roussain, married in 1916 in Sault Ste. Marie, and they had three known children, all born in Sault Ste. Marie or Mamainse.

The Roussain-Turner family had Kinship Connections to the Cadrant-Clermont (FL4003) Verified Métis Family Line. The son of Peter Roussain, named Lawrence Franklin, was baptized in Mamainse in 1923. Lawrence's godfather was Arthur Davieaux of the Cadrant-Clermont family.

This is a Verified Métis Family Line for the following reasons:

- There is evidence that the Métis Root Ancestors were Documented Métis, as well as their Descendants (*i.e.*, the 1861 Census, Ontario Bureau of Mines Report).
- There is evidence that the Métis Root Ancestors were in the Métis Community prior to Effective Control.
- There is evidence that the Roussain-Turner family had Kinship Connections to other Verified Métis Family Lines that made up the Métis Community, namely, to the Cadrant-Clermont Verified Métis family Line (FL4003).
- Through the Historic Records contained in the Supporting Documents, there is evidence that the Métis Root Ancestors and Root Ancestor Descendants had an ongoing presence in the Métis Community for successive generations (between the Métis Root Ancestor and his Descendants, this documented presence spanned about 85 years).
- This Verified Métis Family Line continues to have an ongoing presence within this Métis Community today with many MNO citizens ancestrally connecting to the identified Métis Root Ancestors.

### 3 Background on Verified Métis Family Line

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Charles Roussain and Elizabeth Turner, the Métis Root Ancestors of the Roussain-Turner Verified Métis Family Line (FL4010), settled in the Métis Community at Batchawana Bay as early as 1846. Their sons John


Joseph and Edgar Roussain raised large families in the area, based on their livelihood of harvesting fish.<sup>2</sup> The Roussain-Turner family is connected to the Cadrant-Clermont Verified Métis Family Line (FL4003) through Arthur Davieaux, who was the godparent of Charles and Elizabeth's great-grandson Lawrence Franklin Roussain.<sup>3</sup>

## 5 Relevant References in Historic Record

**Charles Roussain and Elizabeth Turner (Métis Root Ancestors).** Charles Roussain, a Documented Métis, was born in Ontario around 1820.<sup>4</sup> He resided on the eastern shore of Lake Superior at Mamainse and Batchawana Bay where he worked as a fisherman for at least twenty five years.<sup>5</sup> Charles and his wife, Métis Root Ancestor Elizabeth Turner,<sup>6</sup> a Documented Métis, had three known children between 1846 and 1850: John Joseph, Edgar and Edmund.<sup>7</sup> Charles and Elizabeth were enumerated as “H.B.” (half breed) on the 1861 Census of Canada at Mamainse<sup>8</sup> with two unnamed sons and three unnamed girls, ages 4 through 12.<sup>9</sup> William Gibbard, the government inspector of fisheries at Lake Superior, named Charles Roussain in his 1861 report, noting that he was a “half-breed” who had occupied a fishery at Coppermine Point for the past six years.<sup>10</sup> In the 1871 and 1881 Census of Canada Charles was enumerated as a fisherman at Batchawana Bay.<sup>11</sup> In 1871, the family lived near Michel Neveu and Margaret Quentin, whose daughter Susan Neveu married Pierre Gogeosh Jr., a Root Ancestor Descendant of the Cadrant-Clermont Verified Métis Family Line (FL4003).<sup>12</sup> Charles and Elizabeth’s youngest known son Edmund died in Mamainse in 1904.<sup>13</sup>

**John Joseph Roussain (son of Métis Root Ancestor).** John Joseph was born at Batchawana Bay in 1846.<sup>14</sup> In 1877 he married Jane Moore Triscott in Sault Ste Marie and their first child Mary Elizabeth was born in 1878 at Mamainse.<sup>15</sup> John Joseph and Jane had eleven more known children between 1880 and 1901, five of whom (Agnes Jane, Philip Joseph, Francis Edmond, Frances Josephine, and Julia Cecilia) are known to have been born at Mamainse.<sup>16</sup> In the 1881 Census of Canada John Joseph was enumerated as a fisherman at Batchawana Bay.<sup>17</sup> In the 1891 Census of Canada he was enumerated as a fisherman at Mamainse where he resided until at least 1895.<sup>18</sup> Ontario’s *Third Report of the Bureau of Mines* in 1893 recorded that John Joseph Roussain occupied a landmark fishing station on the Mamainse headland referred to as Roussainville.<sup>19</sup>

**Edgar Roussain (son of Métis Root Ancestor).** Edgar was born in 1849 in Ontario.<sup>20</sup> In the 1871 Census of Canada he was enumerated at Batchawana Bay as a fisherman.<sup>21</sup> Edgar married Jane Robinson in Batchawana Bay in 1878.<sup>22</sup> Their three eldest known sons, Charles, John Joseph and Peter Roussain, were born at Mamainse around 1879, 1880 and 1882, respectively.<sup>23</sup> In the 1891 Census of Canada Edgar was enumerated as a fisherman at Mamainse.<sup>24</sup> His youngest known son Richard Robert was born at Mamainse in 1898.<sup>25</sup> In the 1911 Census of Canada for West Algoma, Township of Ryan<sup>26</sup>, Edgar was still employed as a fisherman, and he and five of his children (Peter, Jane (or Jennie), Mary, Alexander and Richard) neighboured Jane Moore Triscott, the widow of his brother John Joseph, and her children.<sup>27</sup>

**Peter Roussain (grandson of Métis Root Ancestor):** Peter (sometimes Pierre), son of Edgar and Jane Robinson, was born around 1882 at Mamainse Harbour.<sup>28</sup> He was enumerated in the 1911 Census of Canada for West Algoma, Township of Ryan, as a fisherman.<sup>29</sup> In 1916 Peter married Edna May Sherlock in Sault Sainte Marie while residing at Mamainse.<sup>30</sup> Their son Lawrence Franklin was baptized in Mamainse in 1923, and his godfather was Arthur Davieaux of the Cadrant-Clermont Verified Métis Family Line (FL4003).<sup>31</sup> Arthur Davieaux also witnessed Peter and Edna's son William Edgar's baptism in 1923, standing as proxy for William Edgar's godfather Richard Roussain.<sup>32</sup>

**Francis Edmond Roussain (grandson of Métis Root Ancestor).** John Joseph and Jane Moore Triscott's son Francis Edmond (sometimes Frank) was born in Mamainse in 1885.<sup>33</sup> He was enumerated in the 1911 Census of Canada for West Algoma, Township of Ryan, as a fisherman.<sup>34</sup> He was appointed in 1910 as the keeper of the Coppermine Point lighthouse, just northwest of Batchawana Bay.<sup>35</sup> In 1918, while living at Mamainse, Francis Edmond married Mabel Sherlock in a civil service in Sault Ste Marie.<sup>36</sup> Their marriage was registered with the Catholic Church in Sault Sainte Marie in 1927.<sup>37</sup> Francis Edmond died in Sault Sainte Marie in 1929.<sup>38</sup>





is merely a straight pier into deep water. Eagle Harbor is well enough to run to in fine weather. Copper Harbor is a good natural harbor. The entrance to Portage Lake, after the improvements are completed, will be a safe place of refuge, and inside a magnificent harbor. Marquette is partly made, but must be somewhat exposed in heavy storms. On the South side of Grand Island is a good natural harbor; from that to White Fish Point there is no shelter for boats, the rivers being all shut with sand. It is a hard coast for small or large vessels during spring and fall.

#### CLIMATE.

There is a very erroneous opinion abroad regarding the extreme severity of the climate of Lake Superior.

On an average, I doubt if Lake Superior is frozen so long as Lake Huron.

I have already stated that all kinds of grain and vegetables can be grown there.

The snow falls deep in many places, and the thermometer, on very cold days, will sink many degrees below zero: but the changes are not sudden.

The climate is well adapted to mining operations; the air is very pure, cool and bracing; men can labour, without fatigue or depression of spirits; fevers are unknown, and the doctors say that contagious diseases lose their virulence in that invigorating climate. The people look healthy, hearty, and muscular; the appetite is enormous. I have noticed among the officers and men of the Hudson Bay and American Fur Companies, as many aged persons as I ever saw in any community or service, and they have all undergone exposures, particularly in the winter season, of no ordinary nature.

The vast body of fresh water modifies the range of the thermometer, lessens the intensity of the cold in winter and the heat in summer. On what are called cold days, if the Lake is open in front of Collingwood Harbor, we are 6 to 8 degrees warmer than they are in Toronto. Between Toronto and Dalhousie, in proportion to the distance, there is a greater difference. The open Lake navigation might be carried on in Lake Superior with certainty nine months in the year. During some winters the Lake is scarcely frozen, and whenever navigation commences at Buffalo and Detroit, *Superior is open*.

Corn is successfully raised to a great extent on Manitoulin Island, and I believe could be raised on Michipicoten Island, and all similar places situated on the South side of a large body of water on Lake Superior.

Two years of thermometrical observations taken at Marquette, from September, 1857, to September, 1859, gave the following average for the four seasons:

#### SETTLEMENTS UNCONNECTED WITH MINING.

Between Groe Cap and Ontonagon River. 1st. *Batcheewaawong Bay*.—Post of Hudson's Bay Company; half-breed in charge, and a few Indian families at mouth of river.

2nd. *Copper Mine Point*.—Charles Roussaint, half-breed, trader, hunter and fishery lessee; has a small clearance.

3rd. *Agiwana*.—Post of Hudson's Bay Company; half-breed in charge, and two or three Indian families.

4th. *Michipicoten River*.—Chief Factor's Post of the Hudson's Bay Company, situated about half a mile up the river on the East bank. This was for many years, and until this year (1860), the depot for the furs going to, and the English goods coming from, Moose Factory. A regular annual brigade was sent from here to Brunswick House, where the

#### MINING LOCATIONS, LAKE SUPERIOR.

1st. *Batcheewauning Bay*.—There are two locations on the list for this Bay,—“James Bell Ewart,” and “Thomas R. Ewart.” I could find no trace of work or improvements; was told that many years ago some blasts were put in on the top of the mountain, on the South-East side.


2nd. *Copper Mine Point and Mamainse*.—On the list are the following Locations: “Hugh Allan and others,” 12 Locations of 400 acres each, and “William E. Meredith.” I believe these belong to the Montreal Mining Company, and extend from Copper Mine Point to Mica Bay. C. Roussaint resides either upon or close to the most Southerly of the two, on Copper Mine Point; has lived there six years, and made good improvements. The Hudson Bay Company, about five years ago, put up a house, since deserted. At Mamainse, in the bottom of a little sand bay, about half a mile East of Mamainse Island, the Montreal Mining Company, in 1854, commenced improvements, and built two first-class two-story log houses, two shanties, root-house, forge, &c.; made a road up to the top of the mountain, and there sunk five shafts, some of them 60 feet deep, and opened veins on the surface in various directions. There is said to have been found on this location an old Indian digging. The Company spent about \$25,000; abandoned the place till 1860. They took out a considerable quantity of copper, and one mass of 620 pounds. The Stamp work here is fully equal to the best stamp work on the South shore. The improvements made were of a practical and economical nature. This mine is well situated, and a steamer can run up to the spot. In the Spring of 1860, Mr. Coatesworth, after my inspection, went from the Bruce to this mine with five miners, for further practical explorations. They opened up a new vein of argentiferous copper ore, 6 inches wide at the surface, and increasing to 2 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet at the depth of 5 feet. This vein was intersected at right angles with several native copper veins. Mr. Coatesworth, with two men, in 7 days, mined and raised 7 barrels of the argentiferous copper, equal to 2 tons in weight, which was conveyed to the Bruce by the steamer “Ploughboy,” and estimated by the smelter to be 15 per cent., or more than six times as rich as the Wellington ore. I am of opinion that this is a valuable Location, and it is so considered by all the miners I have met who are acquainted with it.

3rd. *Mica Bay and Port aux Mines*.—On the list are the following names: “Edward Ryan,” “John Douglas,” “Allan Macdonell,” “Arthur Rankin,” “Port aux Mines.” The Quebec Mining Company, in 1848, '49 and '50, worked here and there between the Montreal Mining Company’s Location and the North side of Port aux Mines. Near the middle of Mica Bay were built two good log houses, and a shaft sunk close to the Lake; at a point immediately South of and close to Point aux Mines, another shaft was sunk and vein opened, and some ore broken ready for crushing. From this place a road was made to the village, where 50 or 60 hewn log and some plastered houses were built, with offices, stores, stables, magazines and sheds. These houses must have cost a large sum of money. More than half the buildings have been since burned down. A large saw-mill was also built. Two expensive roads were made, one from the saw-mill and one from the village,

eron's old mill site at 8.30 p.m., after a run of six hours from Sault Ste. Marie, and tied up for the night. Next morning at 5.30 we steamed up to the head of the bay, past the Batchawana and Harmony rivers, and unloaded a cargo of supplies for Perry's lumber camp. The bay is surrounded by high ranges of hills, which in places recede a mile or more from the shore and in places overhang the water's edge, but everywhere they are thickly covered with small timber.

Good land at the head of the bay. While the boat was unloading I walked with Mr. Cozens some distance out on the lumberman's road, and noticed that the soil was a rich black mould on which the grass grew luxuriantly. The timber is small, being apparently a second growth, but it is very dense. The pine forest is some distance back from the shore. The waters of Batchawana bay north of the island are shallow, and there is great risk of running on

From Perry's Landing to Sand bay. shoals. We left Perry's Landing at 9 o'clock and reached Sand bay at noon, a distance of 37 miles. The round headland west of Batchawana bay is composed of gravelly drift, but beyond it is what appears from the steamer to be an outcropping of sandstone, with a beach of yellowish sand extending northwestward several miles into Pancake bay (Anse aux Crepes) —the southern boundary of the Pancake mining location. Several high ranges of hills run parallel with the shore, covered to their summits with

timber. At the highest point, about 1,300 feet above the lake, surveyors in the employ of the United States Government have planted a station for triangulation work. We took on board the officer in charge of this party near the Sand islands on the return trip.

Pancake Point, on the west side of Pancake bay, is the most southerly part of the Mamainse headland, the shore line of which runs northwestward and northward by Whiskey Point to Point Mamainse, above Sand bay. One mile north of Whiskey Point is Roussainville, a fishing station, which is headquarters for Captain John Roussain, who holds a license to fish from the Point to the northern boundary of Sand bay location.

Note.—This form will be varied in the circumstances of the case may require.

### EXCERPTS FROM THE MARRIAGE ACT

1 GEO. V., CAP. 32.

2. The following persons being men and resident in Canada, may solemnize marriage between persons not under a legal disqualification to contract such marriage:

(a) The ministers and clergymen of every church and religious denomination duly ordained or appointed according to the rites and ceremonies of the church or denomination to which they respectively belong;

(b) Any elder, evangelist or missionary for the time being of any church or congregation of the religious people commonly called or known congregationally as "Congregations of God" or "Congregations of Christ," and individually as "Disciples of Christ," who from time to time is chosen by any such congregation for the solemnization of marriages;

(c) Any duly appointed commissioner or staff officer of the religious society called the Salvation Army, chosen or commissioned by the society to solemnize marriages. R.S.O. 1897, c. 162, s. 2.

(d) Any elder for the time being of the church or congregation of religious people commonly called or known congregationally as "Parrington Independent Church," who from time to time is chosen by such church or congregation for the solemnization of marriages. 4 Edw. VII, c. 10, s. 39.

(e) Any recognized evangelist, teacher or elder for the time being of any congregation of Christians commonly called or known as "Brethren," who may be appointed by any such congregation for the solemnization of marriages, and whose appointment has previously been filed in the office of the Provincial Secretary. 6 Edw. VII, c. 19, s. 2.

4. (1) No minister, clergyman or other person shall solemnize any marriage, unless duly authorized so to do by license under the hand and seal of the Lieutenant-Governor or of his Deputy, or by a certificate under this Act, unless the intention of the persons to intermarry has been published as provided by subsection 2.

5. (1) No marriage shall be solemnized under the authority of any proclamation of intention to intermarry unless such proclamation has been made at least one week previously, nor unless the marriage takes place within three months after the Sunday upon which the proclamation was made; nor shall a marriage be solemnized under the authority of any license or certificate unless within three months after the date thereof.

(2) No clergyman, minister or other person shall solemnize a marriage between the hours of 10 o'clock after noon and 6 o'clock before noon unless he is satisfied from evidence adduced to him that the proposed marriage is legal and that exceptional circumstances exist which render its solemnization between those hours advisable.

(3) No clergyman, minister or other person shall solemnize a marriage without the presence of at least two adult witnesses and two or more of such witnesses shall affix their names as witnesses to the record in the register prescribed by section 24.

(5) The certificate or license to marry or the certificate of proclamation, when such certificate is required, shall be left with the clergyman, minister or other person who solemnizes the marriage, and he shall forthwith after such solemnization endorse upon the certificate or license the date of the marriage and the names and descriptions of the witnesses, and thereupon forward such certificate or license to the Registrar-General. R.S.O. 1897, c. 162, s. 5 (5); 5 Edw. VII, c. 13, s. 15 (1).

16. No license or certificate shall be issued to any person under the age of fourteen years, except where a marriage is shown to be necessary to prevent the illegitimacy of offspring and a certificate to that effect is given by a legally qualified medical practitioner known to the issuer or deputy issuer, and except in such a case no person shall celebrate the marriage ceremony in any case in which either of the contracting parties is under the age of fourteen years to the knowledge or information of such person. R.S.O. 1897, c. 162, s. 16. Part.

(b) Any elder, evangelist or minister for the time being of any church or congregation of the religious people commonly called or known congregations as "Congregations of God" or "Gospel of Christ," and individual "Disciples of Christ," who from time to time is chosen by any such congregation for the solemnization of marriages;

(c) Any duly appointed committee or staff officer of the religious society called the Salvation Army chosen and appointed by the society to solemnize marriages;

(d) Any elder for the time being of any church or congregation of religious people commonly called or known congregations as "Purification Independent Church" who from time to time is chosen by any such congregation for the solemnization of marriages;

(e) Any recognized evangelist or elder for the time being of any congregation of Christians commonly known as "Brethren," who is appointed by any such congregation to solemnize marriages, and such appointment has previously been filed in the office of the Provincial Secretary;

24. No fee shall be payable for a marriage license except the sum of \$5.00.

35 (2). Every person guilty of an act of marriage, or omission in violation of any provision of this Act, for which no other penalty is provided, shall incur a penalty of \$20.00.
